Washington, D.C. Sites



The Iwo Jima Memorial. Sculptor Felix DeWeldon created a life size model of Joe Rosenthal's famous photograph. Paid for by donations, it was later cast in bronze and in September 1954 it was brought to Washington, D.C. as part of a memorial designed by Horace Peaslee. All the major Marine Corps engagements since its founding in 1775 are inscribed on the base. The Iwo Jima Memorial is located near the Arlington cemetery, across the Potomac river from Washington, D.C.



The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum opened in 1993 and has since welcomed more than 23.1 million visitors from all walks of life and reached millions more through a growing range of outreach programs — often conceived in response to public demand. While these statistics are impressive, another story lies in the meaningful, enduring impact that the Museum's programs have had on the individuals who participate in them — students, teachers, law enforcement officers, students at military academies, and others.
